For Coach Jayme Frazier and her student-athletes, it's all about getting the job done right now, striving for excellence no matter what challenge you face.

"This year we have really placed the focus on 'doing your job.' Paying attention to detail and bringing it, every time, to practice, conditioning, the game, and even the classroom," Frazier says.

With a big batch of talented freshmen, along with a core group of sophomore vets, Frazier has taken advantage and spread the strength around the team more. 
